On November 14th, aLL-in Executive Director Amy Smith hosted a Career Pledge Launch Celebration at Dignity Health Sports Park in a groundbreaking effort to increase the economic vitality of our region and community. This endeavor symbolizes a partnership between educators, employers, and government agencies aimed at increasing industry-aligned educational opportunities for students and expanding access to a qualified workforce for employers.

During her 8-month assignment she helped with front desk duties, supervising customers in the resource center, assisting staff with special projects. Demonstrating excellent attendance and contributing many valuable skills along the way. She soon became a favorite among staff and customers. Following her maternity leave she continued to contribute her skills while gaining experience to pursue her career goals.

Toward the close of Deborah's assignment, the WorkPlace hosted a Scan Healthcare recruitment for seasonal hires. She jumped at the opportunity. During her interview the hiring managers were so impressed that they did not want to hire her for the seasonal positions available, but instead created a permanent position just for her.
