Whether working to give adult job seekers the support and training they need to find a good job, helping young people develop their work readiness, or connecting businesses with quality applicants, Pacific Gateway is focused on a productive, well-employed future for all.

ADULT JOB SEEKERS

Not just a job. A good job.

Finding a job is one thing. Finding a stable, rewarding job that pays a living wage is another. In 2014, Pacific Gateway received nearly 5,500 visits from adults looking to update their skills and their résumés in order to achieve the latter. Ultimately, with the help of our Program Specialists, many were able to do just that.

2014 by the numbers:

- 2,491
 adults utilized Pacific Gateway services.
- 1,268 attended workshops.
- 6,443
 new registrants used our VOS job
 search database.
- 1,304
 previous unemployed adults found jobs.
- 106
 veterans were placed with employers.
- 207
 workers ages 40 and older were placed.
- 83.6%
 of those newly employed retained their job.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

Today's youth. Tomorrow's workforce.

The local economy depends on the quality of our workers. Today and in the future. Pacific Gateway Youth Programs are focused on providing 14- to 24-year-olds the skills and work readiness to play a fulfilling role in that future. In 2014, over 900 youth began working toward that goal.

2014 by the numbers:

- 937 youth served by Pacific Gateway.
- 282 completed National Work Readiness Credential (NWRC) Training.
- 430
 attended Personal Enrichment Training and
 were placed in the Youth Jobs Program.
- 225
 youth placed in internship programs.

Uncovering potential. Overcoming barriers.

For Graham, the barriers to employment felt insurmountable. His previous job search experiences had left him understandably skeptical anyone could help him. So when he first came to Pacific Gateway for job search assistance, supportive services, and shelter, he didn't expect much.

Through several consultations with his Program Specialist, he began to open up to his true potential. In one such consultation he happened to mention an interest in cooking. Soon after, his Program Specialist referred him to the St. Joseph's Center in Venice to consider Culinary Training. He was accepted into the program, scored a 99% on the state test, and was ranked in the top 5 among his classmates.

Currently, Graham is working at a prestigious restaurant in Venice earning a healthy income. And, as he proudly states, "It's all legitimate."
